SUBJECT: SRV results for week of 6-10 April 1987

SUMMARY: The site consists of a large place which seems to be some kind of a warehouse, possibly in a dockside location. There are lots of very large "things" sitting around in logical (utilitarian) order, resulting in a physical pattern of locations which looks junky. One of these "things" seems to be of the greatest importance to our tasking, but seems of little importance to the people there.

Of the 3 people I find there, two are dock workers, concerned only with the moving, placement, and storage of all items at the place. One of these is a very heavy man who seems to live in a semi-fantasy world of self importance. The other is a serious, very stocky, but good looking woman. The important "thing" is just another thing to them.

The 3rd person is a person in managerial position over the other two. I get the impression of a dock manager.

While accessing these three people, one (the woman) remembered two men who came to inspect the thing of importance. These two men were very well dressed, in solid black suits, and very formal. They did not deal directly with her, but with the dock manager.

The dock manager remembers the two men only as nuisances, one being VERY serious and nosey, the other having the annoying habit of looking around at everything else, as though he were "casing the joint".

I accessed the serious man, and asked him about the "important thing". I got a series of impressions of a sea-going vessel, barge-looking, and large reels of cables. The item, itself, was of little importance to him, but he was more interested in its final shipping.

RVer's CRITIQUE: I feel that this session was very successful. If so, this will be the first one which was, but again I say that I had a good session. If it doesn't have an apparent match to the assigned target for this week, I feel at this time that the match is there, just not readily apparent. I feel confident of this session.
