Mr. CAMP (for himself and Mr. STUPAK) introduced the following bill; which
was referred to the Committee on Resources

A BILL

To provide for expansion of Sleeping Bear Dunes National
Lakeshore.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. EXPANSION OF SLEEPING BEAR DUNES NA-**
4 **TIONAL LAKESHORE.**

5 (a) IN GENERAL.—When title to the land described
6 in subsection (b) has vested in the United States in fee
7 simple, the boundary of Sleeping Bear Dunes National
8 Lakeshore is revised to include such land in that park.

9 (b) LAND DESCRIBED.—The land referred to in sub-
10 section (a) consists of approximately 104.45 acres of un-
11 improved lands generally depicted on National Park Serv-

1 ice map number 634/80078, entitled “Bayberry Mills, Inc.
2 Crystal River, MI Proposed Expansion Unit to Sleeping
3 Bear Dunes National Lakeshore”. The Secretary of the
4 Interior shall keep such map on file and available for pub-
5 lic inspection in the appropriate offices of the National
6 Park Service.

7 (c) PURCHASE OF LANDS AUTHORIZED.—

8 (1) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary of the Inte-
9 rior may acquire the land described in subsection
10 (b), only by purchase from a willing seller.

11 (2) BUDGET REQUEST.—The Secretary of the
12 Interior shall include in the National Park Service
13 budget submitted for fiscal year 2004 a request for
14 funds necessary for the acquisition authorized by
15 this subsection.

16 (d) LIMITATION ON ACQUISITION BY EXCHANGE OR
17 CONVEYANCE.—The Secretary of the Interior may not ac-
18 quire any of the land described in subsection (b) through
19 any exchange or conveyance of lands that are within the
20 boundary of the Sleeping Bear Dunes National Lakeshore
21 as of the date of the enactment of this Act.

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
