CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

Authorizing the use of the Capitol Grounds for an event
to commemorate the 10th Anniversary of the Million
Man March.

1 *Resolved by the House of Representatives (the Senate*
2 *concurring),*

1 **SECTION 1. USE OF CAPITOL GROUNDS FOR EVENT TO**
 2 **COMMEMORATE 10TH ANNIVERSARY OF MIL-**
 3 **LION MAN MARCH.**

4 (a) IN GENERAL.—Million Man March, Inc. (in this
 5 resolution referred to as the “sponsor”) shall be permitted
 6 to sponsor a public event on the Capitol Grounds to com-
 7 memorate the 10th Anniversary of the Million Man March
 8 (in this resolution referred to as the “event”).

9 (b) DATE OF EVENT.—The event shall be held on
 10 October 15, 2005, or on such other date as the Speaker
 11 of the House of Representatives and the Committee on
 12 Rules and Administration of the Senate jointly designate.

13 **SEC. 2. TERMS AND CONDITIONS.**

14 (a) IN GENERAL.—Under conditions to be prescribed
 15 by the Architect of the Capitol and the Capitol Police
 16 Board, the event shall be—

17 (1) free of admission charge and open to the
 18 public; and

19 (2) arranged not to interfere with the needs of
 20 Congress.

21 (b) EXPENSES AND LIABILITIES.—The sponsor shall
 22 assume full responsibility for all expenses and liabilities
 23 incident to all activities associated with the event.

24 **SEC. 3. EVENT PREPARATIONS.**

25 Subject to the approval of the Architect of the Cap-
 26 itol, the sponsor is authorized to erect upon the Capitol

1 Grounds such stage, sound amplification devices, and
2 other related structures and equipment, as may be re-
3 quired for the event.

4 **SEC. 4. ADDITIONAL ARRANGEMENTS.**

5 The Architect of the Capitol and the Capitol Police
6 Board are authorized to make any such additional ar-
7 rangements that may be required to carry out the event.

8 **SEC. 5. ENFORCEMENT OF RESTRICTIONS.**

9 The Capitol Police Board shall provide for enforce-
10 ment of the restrictions in section 5104(c) of title 40,
11 United States Code, concerning sales, advertisements, dis-
12 plays, and solicitations on the Capitol Grounds, as well
13 as other restrictions applicable to the Capitol Grounds, in
14 connection with the event.
