CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

Authorizing the printing as a House document of “A History, Committee on the Judiciary, United States House of Representatives, 1813–2006”.

1 *Resolved by the House of Representatives (the Senate*
2 *concurring),*

3 **SECTION 1. PRINTING OF DOCUMENT.**

4 (a) IN GENERAL.—The document entitled “A His-
5 tory, Committee on the Judiciary, United States House
6 of Representatives, 1813–2006” (or the document of the
7 history of the Committee on the Judiciary which is pre-
8 pared during the One Hundred Ninth Congress with such
9 similar title as may be provided by the Committee), pre-
10 pared under the direction of the Committee on the Judici-

1 ary of the House of Representatives, shall be printed as
2 a House document, with illustrations and suitable binding,
3 in a style and manner determined by the Joint Committee
4 on Printing.

5 (b) ADDITIONAL COPIES.—With respect to the docu-
6 ment described in subsection (a), in addition to the usual
7 number there shall be printed the lesser of—

8 (1) 900 copies, of which 60 shall be casebound
9 for the use of Members of the Committee on the Ju-
10 diciary; or

11 (2) the maximum number of copies for which
12 the total production and printing cost does not ex-
13 ceed \$80,000, with production and distribution to be
14 allocated in the same proportion as described in
15 paragraph (1).
