Mr. LEWIS of California introduced the following joint resolution; which was referred to the Committee on Appropriations

JOINT RESOLUTION

Making further continuing appropriations for the fiscal year 2007, and for other purposes.

1 *Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives*
2 *of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*
3 That the Continuing Appropriations Resolution, 2007
4 (Public Law 109–289, div. B) is further amended by strik-
5 ing the date specified in section 106(3) and inserting
6 “February 15, 2007”.

7 SEC. 2. Section 102(c) of the Continuing Appropria-
8 tions Resolution, 2007 (Public Law 109–289, div. B) is
9 amended by adding at the end the following new para-
10 graph:

1 “(5) Activities under the ‘Chemical Demili-
2 tarization Construction, Defense-Wide’ account.”.

3 SEC. 3. Section 114(b) of the Continuing Appropria-
4 tions Resolution, 2007 (Public Law 109–289, div. B) is
5 amended by striking “and December 1, 2006,” and insert-
6 ing “December 1, 2006, January 1, 2007, February 1,
7 2007, and March 1, 2007,”.

8 SEC. 4. Section 125 of the Continuing Appropriations
9 Resolution, 2007 (Public Law 109–289, div. B) is amend-
10 ed by striking “Partner Purchases” and inserting “Part-
11 nership Purchases and International Space Station/Multi-
12 User System Support”.

13 SEC. 5. Section 126 of the Continuing Appropriations
14 Resolution, 2007 (Public Law 109–289, div. B) is amend-
15 ed by inserting “(1)” after “except that”, and by inserting
16 before the period at the end the following: “, and (2)
17 amounts made available under section 101 for depart-
18 ments and agencies that have been apportioned pursuant
19 to this section prior to November 17, 2006, may be at
20 a rate for operations not exceeding the current rate”.

21 SEC. 6. Section 101 of the Continuing Appropriations
22 Resolution, 2007 (Public Law 109–289, div. B) is amend-
23 ed by striking “as of October 1, 2006” each place it ap-
24 pears in subsections (b) through (e) and inserting “as of
25 November 15, 2006”.

1 SEC. 7. The Continuing Appropriations Resolution,
2 2007 (Public Law 109–289, div. B) is amended by adding
3 after section 132 the following new sections:

4 “SEC. 133. (a) Section 44302(f)(1) of title 49,
5 United States Code, shall be applied by substituting the
6 date specified in section 106(3) of this division for ‘August
7 31, 2006, and may extend through December 31, 2006’.

8 “(b) Section 44303(b) of title 49, United States
9 Code, shall be applied by substituting the date specified
10 in section 106(3) of this division for ‘December 31, 2006’.

11 “SEC. 134. The authority provided by H. Res. 135
12 (109th Congress), as adopted on March 14, 2005, shall
13 continue in effect through the date specified in section
14 106(3) of this division.

15 “SEC. 135. The rule referenced in section 126 of
16 Public Law 109–54 shall continue in effect for the 2006–
17 2007 winter use season through the date specified in sec-
18 tion 106(3) of this division.

19 “SEC. 136. In addition to any other transfer author-
20 ity of the Department of Veterans Affairs, up to
21 \$683,970,000 of the funds made available to the Depart-
22 ment by this division may be transferred to ‘Veterans
23 Health Administration—Medical Services’ during the pe-
24 riod covered by this division.”.

1 “SEC. 137. Notwithstanding any other provision of
2 this division and notwithstanding section 601(a)(2) of the
3 Legislative Reorganization Act of 1946 (2 U.S.C. 31), the
4 percentage adjustment scheduled to take effect under such
5 section for 2007 shall not take effect until February 16,
6 2007.”.
