# H. R. 3179

## AN ACT

To reauthorize and amend the Junior Duck Stamp  
Conservation and Design Program Act of 1994.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

1 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

2 This Act may be cited as the “Junior Duck Stamp  
3 Reauthorization Amendments Act of 2005”.

4 **SEC. 2. USE OF PROCEEDS FROM LICENSING AND MAR-**  
5 **KETING OF JUNIOR DUCK STAMPS AND JUN-**  
6 **IOR DUCK STAMP DESIGNS.**

7 Section 3(c) of the Junior Duck Stamp Conservation  
8 and Design Program Act of 1994 (16 U.S.C. 719a(c)) is  
9 amended to read as follows:

10 “(c) USE OF PROCEEDS.—Amounts received under  
11 subsection (b)—

12 “(1) shall be available to the Secretary until ex-  
13 pended, without further appropriations, solely for—

14 “(A) awards, prizes, and scholarships to  
15 individuals who submit designs in competitions  
16 under subsection (a), that are—

17 “(i) selected in such a competition as  
18 winning designs; or

19 “(ii) otherwise determined in such a  
20 competition to be superior;

21 “(B) awards and prizes to schools, stu-  
22 dents, teachers, and other participants to fur-  
23 ther education activities related to the conserva-  
24 tion education goals of the Program;

1           “(C) award ceremonies for winners of na-  
2           tional and State Junior Duck Stamp competi-  
3           tions;

4           “(D) travel expenses for winners of na-  
5           tional and State Junior Duck Stamp competi-  
6           tions to award ceremonies, if—

7                   “(i) the event is intended to honor  
8                   students for winning a national competi-  
9                   tion; or

10                   “(ii) the event is intended to honor  
11                   students for winning a State competition;

12           “(E) expenses for licensing and marketing  
13           under subsection (b);

14           “(F) expenses for migratory bird reference  
15           materials or supplies awarded to schools that  
16           participate in the Program; and

17           “(G) expenses for marketing and edu-  
18           cational materials developed to promote the  
19           Program;”.

20 **SEC. 3. AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.**

21           Section 6 of the Junior Duck Stamp Conservation  
22           and Design Program Act of 1994 (16 U.S.C. 719c) is  
23           amended—

24                   (1) by striking “\$250,000” and inserting  
25                   “\$350,000”;

1           (2) by striking “fiscal years 2001 through  
2           2005” and inserting “fiscal years 2006 through  
3           2010”;

4           (3) by inserting “(a) AUTHORIZATION.—” be-  
5           fore the first sentence; and

6           (4) by adding at the end the following:

7           “(b) LIMITATIONS ON USE FOR DISTRIBUTION TO  
8           STATE AND REGIONAL COORDINATORS TO IMPLEMENT  
9           COMPETITIONS.—Of the amount appropriated under this  
10          section for a fiscal year—

11           “(1) not more than \$100,000 may be used by  
12          the Secretary to administer the Program; and

13           “(2) not more than \$250,000 may be distrib-  
14          uted to State and regional coordinators to imple-  
15          ment competitions under the Program.”.

16 **SEC. 4. REPEAL.**

17          The second section 6 of the Junior Duck Stamp Con-  
18          servation and Design Program Act of 1994 (16 U.S.C.  
19          668dd note), relating to an environmental education cen-  
20          ter and refuge headquarters, is repealed.
