Mr. BISHOP of Utah introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Resources

A BILL

To authorize the Secretary of the Interior to study the feasibility of enlarging the Arthur V. Watkins Dam Weber Basin Project, Utah, to provide additional water for the Weber Basin Project to fulfill the purposes for which that project was authorized.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Arthur V. Watkins
5 Dam Enlargement Act of 2005”.

6 **SEC. 2. FINDINGS.**

7 Congress finds the following:

1 (1) Arthur V. Watkins Dam is a feature of the
2 Weber Basin Project, which was authorized by law
3 on August 29, 1949.

4 (2) Increasing the height of Arthur V. Watkins
5 Dam and construction of pertinent facilities may
6 provide additional storage capacity for the develop-
7 ment of additional water supply for the Weber Basin
8 Project for uses of municipal and industrial water
9 supply, flood control, fish and wildlife, and recre-
10 ation.

11 **SEC. 3. AUTHORIZATION OF FEASIBILITY STUDY.**

12 The Secretary of the Interior, acting through the Bu-
13 reau of Reclamation, is authorized to conduct a feasibility
14 study on raising the height of Arthur V. Watkins Dam
15 for the development of additional storage to meet water
16 supply needs within the Weber Basin Project area and the
17 Wasatch Front. The feasibility study shall include such
18 environmental evaluation as required under the National
19 Environmental Policy Act of 1969 (42 U.S.C. 4321 et
20 seq.) and a cost allocation as required under the Reclama-
21 tion Project Act of 1939 (43 U.S.C. 485 et seq.).
