A BILL

To better inform consumers regarding costs associated with compliance for protecting endangered and threatened species under the Endangered Species Act of 1973.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Endangered Species
5 Compliance and Transparency Act of 2006”.

6 **SEC. 2. ENDANGERED SPECIES ACT COMPLIANCE ESTI-**
7 **MATION AND REPORTING.**

8 (a) **CUSTOMER INFORMATION.**—To better inform
9 consumers regarding costs associated with compliance for

1 protecting endangered and threatened species under the
2 Endangered Species Act of 1973 (16 U.S.C. 1531 et seq.),
3 the Administrators of the Bonneville Power Administra-
4 tion, the Western Area Power Administration, the South-
5 western Power Administration, and the Southeastern
6 Power Administration shall each include in monthly bil-
7 lings sent to each firm's power customer information esti-
8 mating and reporting the costs of each customer's share
9 of the direct and indirect costs incurred by each adminis-
10 tration related to compliance with the Endangered Species
11 Act and activities related to such Act.

12 (b) DIRECT COSTS.—Direct costs shall include Fed-
13 eral agency obligations related to study-related costs, cap-
14 ital, operation, maintenance, and replacement costs, and
15 staffing costs.

16 (c) INDIRECT COSTS.—Indirect costs shall include
17 foregone generation and replacement power costs, includ-
18 ing the net costs of any transmission.

19 (d) COORDINATION.—The Bureau of Reclamation
20 and any other affected Federal agencies shall assist the
21 Administrators with the identification of the costs.

22 **SEC. 3. ENDANGERED SPECIES ACT COMPLIANCE REPORT.**

23 No later than January 30 of each year, each Admin-
24 istrator, in coordination with the Bureau of Reclamation
25 and other affected Federal agencies, shall provide an an-

1 nual report to the Committee on Resources of the House
2 of Representatives and the Committee on Environment
3 and Public Works of the Senate estimating direct and in-
4 direct costs associated with compliance with the Endan-
5 gered Species Act of 1973 on a project-by-project basis
6 for the Western Area Power Administration and on a sys-
7 tem-wide basis for each of the other power marketing ad-
8 ministrations.

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
