A BILL

To designate certain National Forest System land in the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico as components of the National Wilderness Preservation System.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

1 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

2 *This Act may be cited as the “Caribbean National For-*
3 *est Act of 2005”.*

4 **SEC. 2. DEFINITIONS.**

5 *In this Act:*

6 (1) *MAP.*—*The term “map” means the map*
7 *dated April 13, 2004, and entitled “El Toro Proposed*
8 *Wilderness Area”.*

9 (2) *SECRETARY.*—*The term “Secretary” means*
10 *the Secretary of Agriculture.*

11 **SEC. 3. WILDERNESS DESIGNATION, CARIBBEAN NATIONAL**
12 **FOREST, PUERTO RICO.**

13 (a) *EL TORO WILDERNESS.*—

14 (1) *IN GENERAL.*—*In furtherance of the purposes*
15 *of the Wilderness Act (16 U.S.C. 1131 et seq.), the ap-*
16 *proximately 10,000 acres of land in the Caribbean*
17 *National Forest/Luquillo Experimental Forest in the*
18 *Commonwealth of Puerto Rico as generally depicted*
19 *on the map are designated as wilderness and as a*
20 *component of the National Wilderness Preservation*
21 *System.*

22 (2) *DESIGNATION.*—*The land designated in*
23 *paragraph (1) shall be known as the El Toro Wilder-*
24 *ness.*

1 (3) *WILDERNESS BOUNDARIES.*—*The El Toro*
2 *Wilderness shall consist of the land generally depicted*
3 *on the map.*

4 (b) *MAP AND BOUNDARY DESCRIPTION.*—

5 (1) *IN GENERAL.*—*As soon as practicable after*
6 *the date of enactment of this Act, the Secretary*
7 *shall—*

8 (A) *prepare a boundary description of the*
9 *El Toro Wilderness; and*

10 (B) *submit the map and the boundary de-*
11 *scription to the Committee on Energy and Nat-*
12 *ural Resources of the Senate and the Committee*
13 *on Resources of the House of Representatives.*

14 (2) *PUBLIC INSPECTION AND TREATMENT.*—*The*
15 *map and the boundary description prepared under*
16 *paragraph (1)(A)—*

17 (A) *shall be on file and available for public*
18 *inspection in the office of the Chief of the Forest*
19 *Service; and*

20 (B) *shall have the same force and effect as*
21 *if included in this Act.*

22 (3) *ERRORS.*—*The Secretary may correct clerical*
23 *and typographical errors in the map and the bound-*
24 *ary description prepared under paragraph (1)(A).*

25 (c) *ADMINISTRATION.*—

1 (1) *IN GENERAL.*—Subject to valid existing
2 rights, the Secretary shall administer the El Toro
3 Wilderness in accordance with the Wilderness Act (16
4 U.S.C. 1131 et seq.) and this Act.

5 (2) *EFFECTIVE DATE OF WILDERNESS ACT.*—
6 With respect to the El Toro Wilderness, any reference
7 in the Wilderness Act (16 U.S.C. 1131 et seq.) to the
8 effective date of that Act shall be deemed to be a ref-
9 erence to the date of the enactment of this Act.

10 (d) *SPECIAL MANAGEMENT CONSIDERATIONS.*—Con-
11 sistent with the Wilderness Act (16 U.S.C. 1131 et seq.),
12 nothing in this Act precludes the installation and mainte-
13 nance of hydrologic, meteorological, climatological, or at-
14 mospheric data collection and remote transmission facili-
15 ties, or any combination of those facilities, in any case in
16 which the Secretary determines that the facilities are essen-
17 tial to the scientific research purposes of the Luquillo Ex-
18 perimental Forest.

Amend the title so as to read: “A bill to designate certain National Forest System land in the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico as a component of the National Wilderness Preservation System.”.
