A BILL

To amend title XVIII of the Social Security Act to provide coverage for lung cancer screening tests for certain high-risk individuals under the Medicare Program.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Medicare Lung Cancer
5 Screening Benefit Act of 2006”.

1 **SEC. 2. MEDICARE COVERAGE OF LUNG CANCER SCREEN-**
2 **ING TESTS FOR HIGH-RISK INDIVIDUALS.**

3 (a) IN GENERAL.—Section 1861(s)(2) of the Social
4 Security Act (42 U.S.C. 1395x(s)(2)) is amended—

5 (1) by striking “and” at the end of subpara-
6 graph (Z);

7 (2) by adding “and” at the end of subpara-
8 graph (AA); and

9 (3) by adding at the end the following new sub-
10 paragraph:

11 “(BB) lung cancer screening tests (as defined
12 in subsection (ccc)).”.

13 (b) SERVICES DESCRIBED.—Section 1861 of such
14 Act is further amended by adding at the end the following
15 new subsection:

16 “Lung Cancer Screening Tests

17 “(ccc)(1) The term ‘lung cancer screening tests’
18 means testing furnished to an individual at risk for lung
19 cancer (as defined in paragraph (2)) for the purpose of
20 early detection of lung cancer, including—

21 “(A) a low dose computerized axial tomography
22 scan;

23 “(B) sputum analysis;

24 “(C) fluorescent bronchoscopy; and

1 “(D) such other tests, and modifications to
2 tests, as the Secretary determines appropriate, in
3 consultation with appropriate organizations.

4 “(2) For purposes of paragraph (1), the term ‘indi-
5 vidual at risk for lung cancer’ means an individual who
6 has any of the following risk factors for lung cancer:

7 “(A) A family history of lung cancer.

8 “(B) A significant smoking history.

9 “(C) Exposure to toxic agents being monitored
10 by the National Academy of Sciences under the
11 Agent Orange Act of 1991 (Public Law 102–4),
12 under the Persian Gulf War Veterans Act of 1998
13 (title XVI of division C of Public Law 105–277), or
14 under the Veterans Program Enhancement Act of
15 1998 (Public Law 105–368).

16 “(D) Significant exposure to radon, asbestos,
17 beryllium, uranium, second hand smoke, or other
18 known carcinogens.

19 “(E) Previous lung disease.

20 “(3) The Secretary shall establish standards, in con-
21 sultation with appropriate organizations, regarding the
22 frequency of coverage of lung cancer screening tests under
23 this title.”.

24 (c) FREQUENCY.—Section 1862(a)(1) of such Act
25 (42 U.S.C. 1395y(a)(1)) is amended—

1 (1) by striking “and” at the end of subpara-
2 graph (M);

3 (2) by striking the semicolon at the end of sub-
4 paragraph (N) and inserting “, and”; and

5 (3) by adding at the end the following new sub-
6 paragraph:

7 “(O) in the case of lung cancer screening tests
8 (as defined in section 1861(ccc)(1)), which are per-
9 formed more frequently than is covered under sec-
10 tion 1861(ccc)(3);”.

11 (d) **EFFECTIVE DATE.**—The amendments made by
12 this section shall apply to tests furnished on or after Janu-
13 ary 1, 2007.

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
