H. R. 5908

To amend title 49, United States Code, to permit certain revenues of private vanpool contractors received from providing public transportation to be used for the purpose of acquiring rolling stock that is not funded, in part, by Federal, State, or local government assistance, and to permit certain expenditures of private vanpool contractors to be credited toward the local matching share of the costs of public transportation projects.

Mr. ROGERS of Michigan (for himself and Mr. EHLERS) introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Transportation and Infrastructure

A BILL

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1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

1 **SECTION 1. GOVERNMENT'S SHARE OF COSTS FOR PUBLIC**
2 **TRANSPORTATION PROJECTS.**

3 Section 5323(i) of title 49, United States Code, is
4 amended by adding at the end the following:

5 “(3) COSTS INCURRED BY PRIVATE VANPOOL
6 CONTRACTORS.—

7 “(A) LOCAL MATCHING SHARE.—The local
8 matching share provided by a recipient of as-
9 sistance for a capital project under this chapter
10 may include amounts expended by a private
11 vanpool contractor of the recipient, without
12 Federal, State, or local governmental assist-
13 ance, for the acquisition of rolling stock to be
14 used by the contractor to provide turnkey public
15 transportation on the recipient’s behalf.

16 “(B) USE OF REVENUES.—A private van-
17 pool contractor may use revenues that the con-
18 tractor receives in providing public transpor-
19 tation that are in excess of the operating costs
20 of the contractor for purposes of acquiring roll-
21 ing stock.

22 “(C) DEFINITIONS.—In this paragraph,
23 the following definitions apply:

24 “(i) PRIVATE VANPOOL CON-
25 TRACTOR.—The term ‘private vanpool con-
26 tractor’ means a private entity providing

1 public transportation pursuant to a con-
2 tract with a recipient of assistance under
3 this chapter using a commuter highway ve-
4 hicle or vanpool.

5 “(ii) COMMUTER HIGHWAY VEHICLE;
6 VANPOOL.—The term ‘commuter highway
7 vehicle’ or ‘vanpool’ means any vehicle—

8 “(I) the seating capacity of which
9 is at least 6 adults (not including the
10 driver); and

11 “(II) at least 80 percent of the
12 mileage use of which can be reason-
13 ably expected to be for the purposes
14 of transporting commuters in connec-
15 tion with travel between their resi-
16 dences and their place of employ-
17 ment.”.

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
