Mr. SESSIONS, from the Committee on Rules, reported the following resolution; which was referred to the House Calendar and ordered to be printed

RESOLUTION

Providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 418) to establish and rapidly implement regulations for State driver's license and identification document security standards, to prevent terrorists from abusing the asylum laws of the United States, to unify terrorism-related grounds for inadmissibility and removal, and to ensure expeditious construction of the San Diego border fence.

1 *Resolved*, That at any time after the adoption of this
2 resolution the Speaker may, pursuant to clause 2(b) of

1 rule XVIII, declare the House resolved into the Committee
2 of the Whole House on the state of the Union for consider-
3 ation of the bill (H.R. 418) to establish and rapidly imple-
4 ment regulations for State driver's license and identifica-
5 tion document security standards, to prevent terrorists
6 from abusing the asylum laws of the United States, to
7 unify terrorism-related grounds for inadmissibility and re-
8 moval, and to ensure expeditious construction of the San
9 Diego border fence. The first reading of the bill shall be
10 dispensed with. All points of order against consideration
11 of the bill are waived. General debate shall be confined
12 to the bill and shall not exceed one hour and 40 minutes,
13 with 40 minutes equally divided and controlled by the
14 chairman and ranking minority member of the Committee
15 on the Judiciary; 40 minutes equally divided and con-
16 trolled by the chairman and ranking minority member of
17 the Committee on Government Reform; and 20 minutes
18 equally divided and controlled by the chairman and rank-
19 ing minority member of the Committee on Homeland Se-
20 curity. After general debate the Committee of the Whole
21 shall rise without motion. No further consideration of the
22 bill shall be in order except pursuant to a subsequent order
23 of the House.
