CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

Expressing the sense of the Congress that a commemorative postage stamp should be issued to promote public awareness of Down syndrome.

- 1 *Resolved by the House of Representatives (the Senate*
2 *concurring)*, That it is the sense of the Congress that—
3 (1) the United States Postal Service should
4 issue a commemorative postage stamp to promote
5 public awareness of Down syndrome; and
6 (2) the Citizens' Stamp Advisory Committee of
7 the United States Postal Service should recommend
8 to the Postmaster General that such a stamp be
9 issued.
