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## CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

Authorizing the use of the Capitol Grounds for the District of Columbia Special Olympics Law Enforcement Torch Run.

1        *Resolved by the House of Representatives (the Senate*  
2        *concurring),*

3        **SECTION 1. AUTHORIZATION OF USE OF CAPITOL**  
4                                **GROUNDS FOR D.C. SPECIAL OLYMPICS LAW**  
5                                **ENFORCEMENT TORCH RUN.**

6        On June 6, 2008, or on such other date as the Speak-  
7        er of the House of Representatives and the Committee on

1 Rules and Administration of the Senate may jointly des-  
2 ignate, the 2008 District of Columbia Special Olympics  
3 Law Enforcement Torch Run (in this resolution referred  
4 to as the “event”) may be run through the Capitol  
5 Grounds as part of the journey of the Special Olympics  
6 torch to the District of Columbia Special Olympics sum-  
7 mer games.

8 **SEC. 2. RESPONSIBILITY OF CAPITOL POLICE BOARD.**

9 The Capitol Police Board shall take such actions as  
10 may be necessary to carry out the event.

11 **SEC. 3. CONDITIONS RELATING TO PHYSICAL PREPARA-**  
12 **TIONS.**

13 The Architect of the Capitol may prescribe conditions  
14 for physical preparations for the event.

15 **SEC. 4. ENFORCEMENT OF RESTRICTIONS.**

16 The Capitol Police Board shall provide for enforce-  
17 ment of the restrictions contained in section 5104(c) of  
18 title 40, United States Code, concerning sales, advertise-  
19 ments, displays, and solicitations on the Capitol Grounds,

1 as well as other restrictions applicable to the Capitol  
2 Grounds, in connection with the event.
