Mr. MCCAUL of Texas (for himself, Mr. BRADY of Texas, and Mr. POE) introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on the Judiciary

A BILL

To amend title 28, United States Code, to prevent administrative action with respect to, and the filing of, certain tort claims against the United States.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Federal Tort Claim
5 Reform Act of 2007”.

6 **SEC. 2. EXCEPTION TO TORT CLAIMS AUTHORITY.**

7 Section 2680 of title 28, United States Code, is
8 amended by adding at the end the following:

1 “(o) Any claim, based on an act or omission by
2 an employee of the Government relating to criminal
3 conduct, that is made by a person who engaged in
4 that conduct, except to the extent the act or omis-
5 sion consists of the purposeful infliction of serious
6 bodily injury and the damages sought by the claim-
7 ant are actual losses resulting from the act or omis-
8 sion. For the purposes of this paragraph the term
9 ‘actual losses’ means medical expenses, lost wages,
10 property damage, and other tangible loss, but may
11 not exceed \$250,000.”.
