A BILL

To direct the United States Sentencing Commission to assure appropriate enhancements of those involved in receiving stolen property where that property consists of grave markers of veterans, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
 2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “~~Let Our Veterans Rest~~
 5 ~~in Peace Act of 2007~~”.

6 **SEC. 2. FINDINGS AND DECLARATION.**

7 The Congress finds and declares that—

8 (1) every cemetery should do all it can to pro-
 9 tect grave markers, headstones, monument or any
 10 other object intended to permanently mark a grave;

11 (2) every citizen of the United States should be
 12 watchful and mindful of these crimes and report any
 13 suspicious behavior to their local or state police; and

14 (3) all citizens, especially veterans, have earned
 15 the right to rest in peace.

16 **SEC. 3. DIRECTION TO THE SENTENCING COMMISSION.**

17 (a) **IN GENERAL.**—Pursuant to its authority under
 18 section 994 of title 28, United States Code, the United

1 States Sentencing Commission shall review and amend the
2 Federal sentencing guideline to provide a sentencing en-
3 hancement for any offense involving the desecration, theft,
4 or trafficking in, a grave marker, monument, headstone
5 or any other object intended to permanently mark a vet-
6 eran's grave.

7 (b) COMMISSION DUTIES.—In carrying out this sec-
8 tion, the Sentencing Commission shall ensure that the sen-
9 tences, guidelines, and policy statements relating to of-
10 fenders convicted of these offenses are—

11 (1) appropriately severe; and

12 (2) reasonably consistent with other relevant di-
13 rectives and other Federal sentencing guidelines.

14 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

15 *This Act may be cited as the “Let Our Veterans Rest*
16 *in Peace Act of 2008”.*

17 **SEC. 2. FINDINGS AND DECLARATION.**

18 *The Congress finds and declares that—*

19 (1) *every cemetery should do all it can to protect*
20 *each grave marker, headstone, monument, or other ob-*
21 *ject, intended to permanently mark a grave;*

22 (2) *every citizen of the United States should be*
23 *watchful and mindful of desecrations of any gravesite*
24 *and report any such suspected behavior to local,*
25 *State, or Federal law enforcement authorities; and*

1 (3) *all citizens, including veterans, have earned*
2 *the right to rest in peace.*

3 **SEC. 3. DIRECTION TO THE SENTENCING COMMISSION.**

4 (a) *IN GENERAL.*—Pursuant to its authority under
5 *section 994 of title 28, United States Code, the United*
6 *States Sentencing Commission shall review and, if appro-*
7 *priate, amend the Federal sentencing guidelines and policy*
8 *statements to ensure the guidelines and policy statements*
9 *provide adequate sentencing enhancements for any offense*
10 *involving the desecration, theft, or trafficking in, a grave*
11 *marker, headstone, monument, or other object, intended to*
12 *permanently mark a veteran’s grave.*

13 (b) *COMMISSION DUTIES.*—In carrying out this sec-
14 *tion, the Sentencing Commission shall—*

15 (1) *ensure that the sentences, guidelines, and pol-*
16 *icy statements relating to offenders convicted of these*
17 *offenses are appropriately severe and reasonably con-*
18 *sistent with other relevant directives and other Fed-*
19 *eral sentencing guidelines and policy statements;*

20 (2) *make any necessary conforming changes to*
21 *the Federal sentencing guidelines; and*

22 (3) *assure that the guidelines adequately meet*
23 *the purposes of sentencing as set forth in section*
24 *3553(a)(2) of title 18, United States Code.*
