## CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

Authorizing the use of the Capitol building and grounds for events to commemorate the 200th anniversary of the laying of the cornerstone of the Capitol.

1        *Resolved by the House of Representatives (the Senate*  
2        *concurring),*

3        **SECTION 1. USE OF CAPITOL BUILDING AND GROUNDS.**

4        The Commission on the Bicentennial of the United  
5 States Capitol (hereinafter in this resolution referred to  
6 as the “Commission”) may use the Capitol building and  
7 grounds on October 23, 1993, or on such other date as  
8 the Speaker of the House of Representatives and the  
9 President pro tempore of the Senate may jointly des-  
10 ignate, for events to commemorate the 200th anniversary  
11 of the laying of the cornerstone of the Capitol.

1 **SEC. 2. TERMS AND CONDITIONS.**

2 The events referred to in section 1 shall be free of  
3 admission charge to the public and arranged under condi-  
4 tions to be prescribed by the Architect of the Capitol and  
5 the Capitol Police Board.

6 **SEC. 3. EVENT PREPARATIONS.**

7 (a) STRUCTURES AND EQUIPMENT.—Subject to the  
8 approval of the Architect of the Capitol, the Commission  
9 is authorized to erect upon the Capitol grounds such  
10 stages, sound amplification devices, and other related  
11 structures and equipment as may be required for the  
12 events referred to in section 1.

13 (b) ADDITIONAL ARRANGEMENTS.—The Architect of  
14 the Capitol and the Capitol Police Board are authorized  
15 to make any such additional arrangements, including the  
16 use of voluntary and uncompensated staff and services,  
17 as may be required to carry out the events referred to in  
18 section 1.

19 (c) REPRESENTATIONS.—The Architect of the Cap-  
20 itol shall take such actions as may be necessary to ensure  
21 that sponsors of the events referred to in section 1 do not

- 1 make representations that such sponsorship in any way
- 2 constitutes an endorsement by the Federal Government.
