Mr. GEPHARDT submitted the following concurrent resolution; which was referred to the Committee on Education and Labor

CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

To recognize and encourage the convening of a National Silver Haired Congress.

Whereas many States have encouraged and facilitated the creation of senior citizen legislative and advocacy bodies;

Whereas in creating such bodies these States have provided many older Americans the opportunity to express concerns, promote appropriate interests, and advance the common good by influencing legislation and actions of State government; and

Whereas a National Silver Haired Congress, with representatives from each State, would provide a national forum for a nonpartisan evaluation of grassroots solutions to concerns shared by an increasing number of older Americans: Now, therefore, be it

3 courages the convening of an annual National Silver
4 Haired Congress in the City of Washington, District of
5 Columbia.
