## CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

Expressing the sense of the Congress that every appropriate effort should be made to avert a humanitarian disaster in Bosnia-Herzegovina and the other former Yugoslav republics during the winter of 1993–1994.

1        *Resolved by the House of Representatives (the Senate*  
2 *concurring)*, That it is the sense of the Congress that—

3            (1) the United States, together with the inter-  
4            national community, should make every appropriate  
5            effort to ensure that the people of Bosnia and  
6            Herzegovina have adequate medical supplies, food,  
7            and other humanitarian assistance during the winter  
8            of 1993–1994 in order to prevent a possible humani-  
9            tarian disaster;

10           (2) the United States should support necessary  
11           and appropriate preparations to facilitate a relief ef-

1 fort in order to prevent a possible humanitarian dis-  
2 aster;

3 (3) all parties should cooperate with the provi-  
4 sion of humanitarian assistance to those in need  
5 throughout the former Yugoslav republics, especially  
6 Bosnia and Herzegovina;

7 (4) the United States should provide similar as-  
8 sistance to the peoples endangered this winter  
9 throughout the former Yugoslav republics, especially  
10 the former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia; and

11 (5) the United States should expend appro-  
12 priated funds for such purposes as expeditiously as  
13 possible.
