Mr. Goss submitted the following concurrent resolution; which was referred jointly to the Committees on the Judiciary and House Administration

CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

Expressing the sense of the Congress regarding terms of office for Members of the Congress.

1 *Resolved by the House of Representatives (the Senate*
2 *concurring)*, That it is the sense of the Congress that—

3 (1) the terms of office for Members of the
4 House of Representatives should be increased from
5 2 years to 4 years;

6 (2) elections for Representatives should be held
7 when the election for the President is held;

8 (3) Representatives should be limited to 3 con-
9 secutive terms of office, but should be eligible for re-

1 election after an absence from the House of Rep-
2 resentatives of at least 4 consecutive years; and

3 (4) Senators should be limited to 2 consecutive
4 terms of office, but should be eligible for reelection
5 after an absence from the Senate of at least 4 con-
6 secutive years.
