CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

Declaring the sense of Congress with respect to the use
of racial quotas and statistics in connection with death
penalty cases.

1 *Resolved by the House of Representatives (the Senate*
2 *concurring)*, That it is the sense of Congress that racial
3 quotas and statistics should not be used to determine
4 whether or not to impose the penalty of death in criminal
5 cases where such penalty is available, but each such deter-
6 mination should be made on the merits of the individual
7 case at hand.
