## CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

Encouraging employee achievement awards.

Whereas the Nation is recovering from a prolonged recession which requires businesses to continue to find ways to increase productivity and quality to enable this country to ready its work force for the year 2000,

Whereas businesses should seek ideas from their employees on improving productivity, quality, efficiency, and competitiveness, which would advance the overall ideas of total quality management, and

Whereas businesses should encourage employees to offer such ideas through monetary and other rewards: Now, therefore, be it,

- 1 *Resolved by the House of Representatives (the Senate*
- 2 *concurring),* That businesses should offer monetary
- 3 awards to employees who offer ideas to improve productiv-

1 ity, quality, efficiency, and competitiveness; and Congress  
2 should encourage such awards by enacting significant tax  
3 incentives for employees to contribute to business produc-  
4 tivity and quality and for businesses to reward such  
5 contributions.
