## **CONCURRENT RESOLUTION**

Acknowledging Major General Jesse Lee Reno and the 125th  
birthday of the city of Reno.

Whereas Major General Jesse Lee Reno commanded the  
Union forces at Chantilly, Virginia, in 1861;

Whereas the Union victory at the Battle of Chantilly saved  
the Nation's Capitol from possible attack and destruction  
by Confederate forces;

Whereas General Reno was subsequently killed in action in  
1862 at the Battle of South Mountain, Maryland;

Whereas, on May 9, 1868, the railroad depot near the com-  
munity of Lake's Crossing, in the Truckee Meadows of  
the State of Nevada, was renamed Reno in honor of  
Major General Reno;

Whereas May 9, 1993, is the 125th anniversary of the founding of the city of Reno;

Whereas the citizens of the city of Reno will commemorate this historic occasion on May 8 and 9, 1993, by celebrating the city's founding with "The Biggest Little Birthday Party in the World";

Whereas the Governor of the State of Nevada has proclaimed May 8 and 9, 1993, as "Celebration Reno" throughout the State of Nevada; and

Whereas there will be formal ceremonies in Reno on May 8, 1993, to commemorate the 125th anniversary of the founding of the city of Reno: Now, therefore, be it

1        *Resolved by the House of Representatives (the Senate*  
2 *concurring), That the Congress—*

3            (1) acknowledges the debt of gratitude that the  
4        Nation owes to the late Major General Jesse Lee  
5        Reno, United States Army; and

6            (2) joins with the Governor of the State of Ne-  
7        vada in acknowledging May 8 and 9, 1993, as "Cele-  
8        bration Reno" in honor of the 125th birthday of the  
9        founding of the city of Reno.
