## **JOINT RESOLUTION**

To designate the week beginning September 19, 1993, as “National Historically Black Colleges Week”.

Whereas there are 107 Historically Black Colleges and Universities in the United States;

Whereas such colleges and universities provide the quality education so essential to full participation in a complex, highly technological society;

Whereas black colleges and universities have a rich heritage and have played a prominent role in American history;

Whereas such institutions have allowed many underprivileged students to attain their full potential through higher education; and

Whereas the achievements and goals of the Historically Black Colleges and Universities are deserving of national recognition: Now, therefore, be it

1       *Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives*

2       *of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3       That the week beginning September 19, 1993, is des-

4       ignated as “National Historically Black Colleges Week”

5       and the President is authorized and requested to issue a

6       proclamation calling upon the people of the United States

7       and interested groups to observe such week with appro-

8       priate ceremonies, activities, and programs, thereby dem-

9       onstrating support for Historically Black Colleges and

10       Universities in the United States.
