Mr. CRANE introduced the following joint resolution; which was referred to the  
Committee on Post Office and Civil Service

## **JOINT RESOLUTION**

Designating May 1994 as “National Sporting Goods Month”.

Whereas a program of regular exercise and good nutrition  
has been shown to be the best prescription to a longer  
and healthier life;

Whereas more than 22,000 sporting goods retailers and more  
than 3,000 manufacturers and sales agents promote good  
health and fitness through participation in sports activi-  
ties;

Whereas millions of Americans participate in sports activities  
each year;

Whereas 6 of the 10 most popular sports activities as surveyed annually by the National Sporting Goods Association are fitness related activities;

Whereas more Americans of all ages are participating in a regular exercise program;

Whereas the National Sporting Goods Association has served sporting goods retailers, manufacturers, and sales agents on a not-for-profit basis; and

Whereas for 65 years the sporting goods industry, with the National Sporting Goods Association, has promoted good fitness as a way of life: Now, therefore, be it

1       *Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives*  
2       *of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*  
3       That May 1994 is designated as “National Sporting  
4       Goods Month”, and the President is authorized and re-  
5       quested to issue a proclamation calling on the people of  
6       the United States to observe that month with appropriate  
7       ceremonies and activities.
