Mr. WALKER introduced the following joint resolution; which was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means

JOINT RESOLUTION

Affirming the legislative intent under the Social Security Act to provide for increases in old-age insurance benefits with due regard to increases in the cost of living.

1 *Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives*
2 *of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*
3 That it is hereby affirmed that, as intended by the reforms
4 to the Old Age Insurance Program of title II of the Social
5 Security Act enacted in 1977 and thereafter, individuals
6 born after 1916 and receiving benefits under such pro-
7 gram after the enactment of such reforms have received

1 and continue to receive such benefits at rates not less than
2 rates which are consistent with the policies intended at
3 the time of the enactment of the cost-of-living adjustment
4 provisions of such program in 1972, and benefits under
5 such program continue to be determined under a benefit
6 formula which increases benefits with due regard to in-
7 creases in the cost of living.
