2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

1 **SECTION 1. ERISA PREEMPTION RULES NOT TO APPLY TO**
2 **CERTAIN ADDITIONAL STATE LAWS.**

3 Section 514(b) of the Employee Retirement Income
4 Security Act of 1974 (29 U.S.C. 1144(b)) is amended by
5 adding at the end the following new paragraph:

6 “(9) Subsection (a) shall not apply to—

7 “(A) any provision of State law to the extent
8 that such provision requires the payment of prevail-
9 ing wages, including employee benefits, on public
10 projects and permits any prevailing employee benefit
11 plan contribution or cost requirement of such law to
12 be met by crediting—

13 “(i) the payment of employee benefit plan
14 contributions or costs,

15 “(ii) the payment of wages in lieu of such
16 contributions or costs, or

17 “(iii) the payment of a combination of
18 wages and such contributions or costs;

19 except that this subparagraph shall not be construed
20 to exempt from subsection (a) any such provision to
21 the extent it otherwise mandates the maintenance of,
22 or otherwise regulates the benefits or operations of,
23 any employee benefit plan;
