A BILL

1 **SECTION 1. NOTIFICATION OF LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFI-**
2 **CERS OF DISCOVERIES OF CONTROLLED SUB-**
3 **STANCES AND/OR LARGE SUMS OF CASH IN**
4 **EXCESS OF \$10,000 IN WEAPON SCREENING.**

5 Section 315 of the Federal Aviation Act of 1958 (49
6 U.S.C. App. 1356) is amended by redesignating subsection
7 (c) as subsection (d) and by adding after subsection (b)
8 the following new subsection:

9 “(c) DISCOVERIES OF CONTROLLED SUBSTANCES
10 AND/OR CASH IN EXCESS OF \$10,000.—Not later than
11 ninety days after the date of the enactment of this sub-
12 section, the Administrator shall issue regulations requiring
13 employees and agents referred to in subsection (a) to re-
14 port to appropriate Federal and State law enforcement of-
15 ficers any incident in which the employee or agent, in the
16 course of conducting screening procedures pursuant to
17 subsection (a), discovers a controlled substance the posses-
18 sion of which may be a violation of Federal or State law,
19 and/or any sizable sums of cash in excess of \$10,000 the
20 possession of which may be a violation of Federal or State
21 Law.”.
