A BILL

To direct the Secretary of the Interior to conduct a study of the historical and cultural resources in the vicinity of the city of Lynn, Massachusetts, and make recommendations on the appropriate role of the Federal Government in preserving and interpreting such historical and cultural resources.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. LYNN, MASSACHUSETTS.**

4 (a) STUDY OF POTENTIAL NATIONAL HISTORIC
5 LANDMARKS.—The Secretary of the Interior (hereinafter

1 in this section referred to as the “Secretary”) shall con-
2 duct a study to identify potential National Historic Land-
3 marks in Lynn, Massachusetts. The study shall emphasize
4 the processes of industrialization, urbanization and immi-
5 gration in order to identify resources significant and
6 unique in the larger context of American history. As part
7 of the study, the Secretary shall propose alternatives for
8 cooperation in the preservation and interpretation of po-
9 tential National Historic Landmarks identified in the
10 study and for the preservation and interpretation of exist-
11 ing national historic landmarks in Lynn.

12 (b) CONGRESSIONAL REVIEW.—The Secretary shall
13 transmit the study to the appropriate committees of Con-
14 gress within 18 months after the enactment of this Act.

15 (c) CONSULTATION.—In preparing the study under
16 this section, the Secretary shall consult with the public,
17 with representatives of the city of Lynn and the common-
18 wealth of Massachusetts, with historians, planners and
19 historic preservationists knowledgeable in American his-
20 tory, historic preservation, and architecture. The Sec-
21 retary shall seek expertise from both local and national
22 organizations.

23 (d) AUTHORIZATION.—There is authorized to be ap-
24 propriated \$200,000 to carry out this Act.
