A BILL

To extend until December 31, 1998, the temporary suspension of duties on 7-Acetyl-1,1,3,4,4,6-hexamethyltetrahydronaphthalene.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. EXTENSION OF TEMPORARY SUSPENSION OF**
4 **DUTIES ON 7-ACETYL-1,1,3,4,4,6-HEXA-**
5 **METHYLTETRAHYDRONAPHTHALENE.**

6 That heading 9902.30.16 of the Harmonized Tariff
7 Schedule of the United States is amended by striking out
8 “12/31/92” and inserting in lieu thereof “12/31/98.”

1 **SEC. 2. EFFECTIVE DATE.**

2 (a) IN GENERAL.—Except as provided in paragraph
3 (2), the amendments made by this Act shall apply with
4 respect to goods entered, or withdrawn from warehouse
5 for consumption, on or after the 15th day after the date
6 of the enactment of this Act.

7 (b) RETROACTIVE APPLICATION FOR CERTAIN LIQ-
8 UIDATIONS AND RELIQUIDATIONS.—Notwithstanding sec-
9 tion 514 of the Tariff Act of 1930 or any other provision
10 of law, upon proper request filed with the appropriate cus-
11 toms officer on or before the 90th day after the date of
12 enactment of this Act, any entry—

13 (1) that was made after December 31, 1992,
14 and before the 15th day after such enactment; and

15 (2) with respect to which there would have been
16 a lesser or no duty if any amendment made by this
17 Act applied to such entry;
18 shall be liquidated or reliquidated as though such amend-
19 ment applied to such entry.
