1 “(2) The map referred to in paragraph (1) shall be
2 kept on file and available for public inspection in the ap-
3 propriate offices of the National Park Service, the office of
4 the State Director of the Bureau of Land Management lo-
5 cated in Santa Fe, New Mexico, the office of the Area Direc-
6 tor of the Bureau of Indian Affairs located in Window
7 Rock, Arizona, and the offices of the Arizona and New Mex-
8 ico State Historic Preservation Officers.”.

9 **SEC. 4. ACQUISITIONS.**

10 Section 504(c)(2) of Public Law 96-550 (16 U.S.C.
11 410ii-3(c)(2)) is amended to read as follows:

12 “(2) The Secretary shall seek to use a combina-
13 tion of land acquisition authority under this section
14 and cooperative agreements (pursuant to section 505)

1 *to accomplish the purposes of archeological resource*
2 *protection at those sites described in section 502(b)*
3 *that remain in private ownership.”.*

4 **SEC. 5. ASSISTANCE TO THE NAVAJO NATION.**

5 *Section 506 of Public Law 96–550 (16 U.S.C. 410ii–*
6 *5) is amended by adding the following new subsection at*
7 *the end thereof:*

8 *“(f) The Secretary, acting through the Director of the*
9 *National Park Service, shall assist the Navajo Nation in*
10 *the protection and management of those Chaco Culture Ar-*
11 *cheological Protection Sites located on lands under the ju-*
12 *risdiction of the Navajo Nation through a grant, contract,*
13 *or cooperative agreement entered into pursuant to the In-*
14 *dian Self-Determination and Education Act (Public Law*
15 *93–638), as amended, to assist the Navajo Nation in site*
16 *planning, resource protection, interpretation, resource man-*
17 *agement actions, and such other purposes as may be identi-*
18 *fied in such grant, contract, or cooperative agreement. This*
19 *cooperative assistance shall include assistance with the de-*
20 *velopment of a Navajo facility to serve those who seek to*
21 *appreciate the Chacoan Outlier Sites.”.*
