## A BILL

To suspend temporarily the duty on Pigment Blue 60.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. PIGMENT BLUE 60.**

4 (a) IN GENERAL.—Subchapter II of chapter 99 of  
5 the Harmonized Tariff Schedule of the United States is  
6 amended by inserting in numerical sequence the following  
7 new heading:

9902.32.12	Pigment Blue 60 (CAS No. 81-77-6) (provided for in subheading 3204.17.50) .....	Free	No change	No change	On or before 12/31/97	..

8 (b) EFFECTIVE DATE.—

9 (1) IN GENERAL.—The amendment made by  
10 this section applies with respect to goods entered, or

1        withdrawn from warehouse for consumption, on or  
2        after the 15th day after the date of the enactment  
3        of this Act.

4            (2) RETROACTIVE APPLICATION TO CERTAIN  
5        ENTRIES.—Notwithstanding section 514 of the Tar-  
6        iff Act of 1930 (19 U.S.C. 1514) or any other provi-  
7        sion of law, upon proper request filed with the ap-  
8        propriate customs officer before the 90th day after  
9        the date of the enactment of this Act, any entry, or  
10       withdrawal from warehouse for consumption, of any  
11       goods described in heading 9902.32.12 of the Har-  
12       monized Tariff Schedule of the United States (as  
13       added by subsection (a)) that was made—

14            (A) after December 31, 1992; and

15            (B) before the 15th day after the date of  
16       the enactment of this Act;

17       shall be liquidated or reliquidated as though such  
18       entry or withdrawal occurred on the 15th day after  
19       the date of the enactment of this Act.
