## A BILL

To extend until January 1, 1997, the existing suspension  
of duty on graphite.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. GRAPHITE.**

4 Heading 9902.25.04 of the Harmonized Tariff  
5 Schedule of the United States (relating to graphite) is  
6 amended by striking “12/31/92” and inserting “12/31/  
7 96”.

8 **SEC. 2. APPLICABILITY.**

9 (a) IN GENERAL.—The amendment made by section  
10 1 shall take effect on the 15th day after the date of the  
11 enactment of this Act.

1 (b) RETROACTIVE PROVISION.—Notwithstanding sec-  
2 tion 514 of the Tariff Act of 1930 or any other provision  
3 of law to the contrary, upon a request filed with the appro-  
4 priate customs officer before the 90th day after the date  
5 of the enactment of this Act, any entry or withdrawal from  
6 warehouse for consumption of goods to which the amend-  
7 ment made by section 1 applies and that was made—

8 (1) after December 31, 1992; and

9 (2) before the 15th day after the date of the en-  
10 actment of this Act;

11 and with respect to which there would have been no duty  
12 or a lower duty if the amendment made by section 1 had  
13 applied to such entry or withdrawal, shall be liquidated  
14 or reliquidated as though such entry or withdrawal had  
15 occurred on such 15th day.
