Mr. EDWARDS of California introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on the Judiciary

A BILL

To preserve the integrity of certain athletic competition in sports.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Sports Standards Act
5 of 1993”.

6 **SEC. 2. IMMUNITY TO LIABILITY.**

7 A sports organization that—

8 (1) is incorporated under the laws of any of the
9 several States or of the District of Columbia;

1 (2) is described in section 501(a) of the Inter-
2 nal Revenue Code of 1986 and is exempt from tax-
3 ation under section 501(c)(3) of such Code;

4 (3) has as its purpose the advancement of ath-
5 letic competition in a sport;

6 (4) consults with a similarly situated foreign
7 sports organization for the purpose of establishing
8 and interpreting all rules and equipment standards
9 for national and international competition in such
10 sport; and

11 (5) publishes such rules and such standards so
12 established for the benefit of its members and the
13 general public;

14 shall not be liable under any law relating to restraints of
15 trade or commerce for engaging in such consultations or
16 for so establishing or interpreting such rules or such
17 standards in good faith pursuant to such consultations.
