## A BILL

To extend until January 1, 1997, the existing suspension  
of duty on mercuric oxide.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. EXTENSION OF EXISTING SUSPENSION OF**  
4 **DUTY ON MERCURIC OXIDE.**

5 Heading 9902.28.25 of the Harmonized Tariff  
6 Schedule of the United States is amended by striking “12/  
7 31/92” and inserting “12/31/96”.

8 **SEC. 2. EFFECTIVE DATE.**

9 (a) IN GENERAL.—The amendment made by section  
10 1 applies with respect to goods entered, or withdrawn from

1 warehouse for consumption, on or after the 15th day after  
2 the date of the enactment of this Act.

3 (b) RETROACTIVE PROVISION.—Notwithstanding sec-  
4 tion 514 of the Tariff Act of 1930 or any other provision  
5 of law to the contrary, upon a request filed with the appro-  
6 priate customs officer before the 180th day after the date  
7 of the enactment of this Act, any entry or withdrawal from  
8 warehouse for consumption of goods to which the amend-  
9 ment made by section 1 applies and that was made—

10 (1) after December 31, 1992; and

11 (2) before the 15th day after the date of the en-  
12 actment of this Act;

13 and with respect to which there would have been a lower  
14 duty if the amendment made by section 1 had applied to  
15 such entry or withdrawal, shall be liquidated or  
16 reliquidated as though such entry or withdrawal had oc-  
17 curred on such 15th day.
