For the relief of Orlando Wayne Naraysingh.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. IMMEDIATE RELATIVE STATUS FOR ORLANDO**

4 **WAYNE NARAYSINGH.**

5 (a) IN GENERAL.—Orlando Wayne Naraysingh shall
6 be classified as a child under section 101(b)(1)(E) of the
7 Immigration and Nationality Act for purposes of approval
8 of a relative visa petition filed under section 204 of such
9 Act by his adoptive parent and the filing of an application
10 for an immigrant visa or adjustment of status.

1 (b) ADJUSTMENT OF STATUS.—If Orlando Wayne
2 Naraysingh enters the United States before the filing
3 deadline specified in subsection (c), he shall be considered
4 to have entered and remained lawfully and shall, if other-
5 wise eligible, be eligible for adjustment of status under
6 section 245 of the Immigration and Nationality Act as of
7 the date of the enactment of this Act.

8 (c) DEADLINE FOR APPLICATION AND PAYMENT OF
9 FEES.—Subsections (a) and (b) shall apply only if the pe-
10 tition and the application for issuance of an immigrant
11 visa or the application for adjustment of status are filed
12 with appropriate fees within 2 years after the date of the
13 enactment of this Act.

14 (d) REDUCTION OF IMMIGRANT VISA NUMBER.—
15 Upon the granting of an immigrant visa or permanent res-
16 idence to Orlando Wayne Naraysingh, the Secretary of
17 State shall instruct the proper officer to reduce by 1, for
18 the current or next following fiscal year, the worldwide
19 level of family-sponsored immigrants under section
20 201(c)(1)(A) of the Immigration and Nationality Act.

21 (e) DENIAL OF PREFERENTIAL IMMIGRATION
22 TREATMENT FOR CERTAIN RELATIVES.—The natural
23 parents, brothers, and sisters of Orlando Wayne
24 Naraysingh shall not, by virtue of such relationship, be

1 accorded any right, privilege, or status under the Immi-
2 gration and Nationality Act.
