A BILL

To provide for annual observances of certain legal public holidays on their traditional dates.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. LEGAL PUBLIC HOLIDAYS.**

4 (a) DESIGNATION OF HOLIDAYS.—Section 6103(a)
5 of title 5, United States Code, is amended to read as
6 follows:

7 “(a) The following are legal public holidays:

8 “New Year’s Day, January 1.

9 “Birthday of Martin Luther King, Jr., January

10 15.

1 “Washington’s Birthday, February 22.

2 “Memorial Day, May 30.

3 “Independence Day, July 4.

4 “Labor Day, the 1st Monday in September.

5 “Columbus Day, October 12.

6 “Veterans Day, November 11.

7 “Thanksgiving Day, the 4th Thursday in
8 November.

9 “Christmas Day, December 25.”.

10 (b) DAYS FOR OBSERVANCE.—Any reference in a law
11 of the United States to the observance of a legal public
12 holiday on a day other than the day prescribed for the
13 observance of the holiday by section 6103(a) of title 5,
14 United States Code (as amended by subsection (a) of this
15 section) shall be considered to be a reference to the day
16 for the observance of the holiday prescribed in such
17 section.

18 **SEC. 2. EFFECTIVE DATE.**

19 Section 1 shall take effect on January 1, 1994.
