1 ADMINISTRATIVE PROVISIONS

2 *SEC. 1. (a) Charges for expenses of any office, the funds*
3 *of which are disbursed by the Secretary of the Senate, may*
4 *be vouchered by a Senate support office paying such ex-*
5 *penses or to which such charges are owed for goods or serv-*
6 *ices provided, if—*

7 *(1) such charges are paid on behalf of the office*
8 *incurring such expenses by such Senate support office;*
9 *or*

10 *(2) such charges are payable to such Senate sup-*
11 *port office for goods or services provided by such office*
12 *to the office incurring such expenses.*

13 *(b) Payments under this section shall be charged to*
14 *the official funds of the office on whose behalf the expenses*
15 *were paid, or which received the goods or services for which*
16 *payment is required.*

17 *(c) Any voucher submitted by a Senate support office*
18 *pursuant to this section shall be accompanied by a certifi-*
19 *cation from such office of the amount and that such pur-*
20 *chases were of the nature that they could be charged to the*
21 *official funds of the office on whose behalf charges were paid,*
22 *or to which goods or services were provided.*

23 *(d) Vouchers under this section shall be submitted and*
24 *paid subject to such regulations as may be promulgated by*
25 *the Committee on Rules and Administration.*

1 *SEC. 2. Effective on and after October 1, 1993, the ag-*
2 *gregate of each of the sums determined under clauses (iii)*
3 *and (iv) of section 506(b)(3)(A) of the Supplemental Appro-*
4 *priations Act, 1973 (2 U.S.C. 58(b)(3)(A) (iii) and (iv)),*
5 *shall be deemed decreased by 2.5 percent.*

6 *SEC. 3. Section 12 under the subheading “ADMINIS-*
7 *TRATIVE PROVISIONS” under the heading “SENATE” in the*
8 *Legislative Branch Appropriations Act, 1991 (2 U.S.C.*
9 *58c-1) is amended in the first sentence by striking “the*

9 *contributions from Federal sources. The Center may also*
10 *receive contributions both in-kind and cash from private*
11 *and other non-Federal sources.*

14 *made available from any source for any fiscal year may*

18 *duplicating is requisitioned through the Government Print-*
19 *ing Office.*

20 *(2) Paragraph (a)(1) does not apply to (A) individual*
21 *printing or duplicating orders costing not more than*
22 *\$1,000, if the work is not of a continuing or repetitive na-*
23 *ture, and, as certified by the Public Printer, cannot be pro-*
24 *vided more economically by open, competitive procurement*
25 *through the Government Printing Office, (B) printing for*

1 *the Central Intelligence Agency, the Defense Intelligence*
2 *Agency, the National Security Agency, or specifically classi-*
3 *fied material of the Department of Defense, or (C) printing*
4 *from other sources that is specifically authorized by law.*
5 *The Secretary may waive the limitations of subsection (a)*
6 *for military operational requirements: Provided, That the*
7 *Secretary shall notify the Joint Committee on Printing*
8 *within seven days.*

9 (3) *As is used in this subsection, the terms “printing”*
10 *or “duplicating” include the processes of: Composition;*
11 *platemaking; wet and dry offset; letterpress; gravure; flexog-*
12 *raphy; ink jet; electrostatic or other copying; laser or vari-*
13 *able imaging; silk screen processes; production of an image*
14 *on paper or other substrate by any means or equipment;*
15 *binding; microfilm; or the end items of such processes.*
