A BILL

To extend until January 1, 1995, the previously existing suspension of duty on fresh, chilled, or frozen brussels sprouts.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. EXTENSION OF PREVIOUSLY EXISTING SUSPEN-**
4 **SION OF DUTY ON FRESH, CHILLED, OR FRO-**
5 **ZEN BRUSSELS SPROUTS.**

6 Heading 9902.07.04 of the Harmonized Tariff
7 Schedule of the United States is amended by striking
8 “12/31/92” and inserting “12/31/94”.

1 **SEC. 2. APPLICABILITY.**

2 (a) IN GENERAL.—The amendment made by section
3 1 shall take effect on the 15th day after the date of the
4 enactment of this Act.

5 (b) RETROACTIVE PROVISION.—Notwithstanding sec-
6 tion 514 of the Tariff Act of 1930 or any other provision
7 of law to the contrary, upon a request filed with the appro-
8 priate customs officer before the 90th day after the date
9 of the enactment of this Act, any entry or withdrawal from
10 warehouse for consumption of goods to which the amend-
11 ment made by section 1 applies and that was made—

12 (1) after December 31, 1992; and

13 (2) before the 15th day after the date of the en-
14 actment of this Act;

15 and with respect to which there would have been no duty
16 or a lower duty if the amendment made by section 1 had
17 applied to such entry or withdrawal, shall be liquidated
18 or reliquidated as though such entry or withdrawal had
19 occurred on such 15th day.
