A BILL

To amend the National and Community Service Act of 1990 to establish a preference in favor of service programs and projects conducted in areas adversely affected by Federal actions related to the management of Federal lands that result in significant regional job losses and economic dislocation.

3 **SECTION 1. PREFERENCE FOR PROGRAMS AND PROJECTS**

4 **CONDUCTED IN DISTRESSED AREAS.**

5 (a) GRANTS UNDER THE YOUTH CORPS PROGRAM.—

6 Section 129(b) of the National and Community Service

1 Act of 1990 (42 U.S.C. 12549(b)) is amended by striking
2 the period and inserting the following: “and ensure that
3 programs and projects would be conducted in areas where
4 they are needed most, including areas adversely affected
5 by Federal actions related to the management of Federal
6 lands that result in significant regional job losses and eco-
7 nomic dislocation.”.

8 (b) GRANTS UNDER THE NATIONAL AND COMMU-
9 NITY SERVICE PROGRAM.—Section 142(a) of such Act (42
10 U.S.C. 12572(a)) is amended—

11 (1) in paragraph (3), by striking “and”;

12 (2) in paragraph (4), by striking the period at
13 the end and inserting “; and”; and

14 (3) by adding at the end the following new
15 paragraph:

16 “(5) the extent to which the proposed program
17 would be conducted in areas where it is needed most,
18 including areas adversely affected by Federal actions
19 related to the management of Federal lands that re-
20 sult in significant regional job losses and economic
21 dislocation.”.
