A BILL

To extend until January 1, 1995, the previously existing suspensions of duty on certain chemicals.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SUSPENSIONS OF DUTY ON CERTAIN CHEMI-**

4 **CALS.**

5 Subchapter II of chapter 99 of the Harmonized Tar-
6 iff Schedule of the United States is amended by striking
7 “12/31/92” and inserting “12/31/94” in each of the fol-
8 lowing headings:

9 (1) Heading 9902.30.14 (relating to Neville and
10 Winter’s acid).

1 (2) Heading 9902.30.41 (relating to Broenner's
2 acid).

3 (3) Heading 9902.30.42 (relating to D Salt).

4 (4) Heading 9902.30.60 (relating to naphthol AS
5 types).

6 (5) Heading 9902.30.62 (relating to anis base).

7 **SEC. 2. APPLICABILITY.**

8 (a) IN GENERAL.—The amendments made by section
9 1 shall take effect on the 15th day after the date of the
10 enactment of this Act.

11 (b) RETROACTIVE PROVISION.—Notwithstanding sec-
12 tion 514 of the Tariff Act of 1930 or any other provision
13 of law to the contrary, upon a request filed with the appro-
14 priate customs officer before the 90th day after the date
15 of the enactment of this Act, any entry or withdrawal from
16 warehouse for consumption of goods to which any amend-
17 ment made by section 1 applies and that was made—

18 (1) after December 31, 1992; and

19 (2) before the 15th day after the date of the en-
20 actment of this Act;

21 and with respect to which there would have been no duty
22 or a lower duty if the amendment made by section 1 had
23 applied to such entry or withdrawal, shall be liquidated
24 or reliquidated as though such entry or withdrawal had
25 occurred on such 15th day.
