A BILL

To amend title 10, United States Code, to limit the transfer of Department of Defense funds to other departments and agencies of the United States.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

1 **SECTION 1. LIMITATION ON TRANSFER OF DEPARTMENT**
2 **OF DEFENSE FUNDS TO OTHER DEPART-**
3 **MENTS AND AGENCIES.**

4 (a) IN GENERAL.—(1) Chapter 131 of title 10, Unit-
5 ed States Code, is amended by adding at the end the fol-
6 lowing new section:

7 **“§ 2219. Transfer of Department of Defense funds to**
8 **other departments and agencies: limita-**
9 **tion**

10 “(a) NATIONAL SECURITY REQUIREMENT.—Funds
11 appropriated or otherwise made available for military
12 functions of the Department of Defense may not be made
13 available to any other department or agency of the Federal
14 Government pursuant to a provision of law enacted after
15 the date of the enactment of this section (notwithstanding
16 the provisions of such law) unless, not less than 30 days
17 before such funds are made available to such other depart-
18 ment or agency, the Secretary of Defense submits to Con-
19 gress a certification that making those funds available to
20 such other department or agency is in the national secu-
21 rity interest of the United States.

22 “(b) WAIVER AUTHORITY DURING NATIONAL EMER-
23 GENCIES.—The Secretary of Defense may waive sub-
24 section (a) during a period of national emergency declared
25 by the President or by Congress. The waiver may not take

1 effect until notice of the waiver is submitted by the Sec-
2 retary of Defense to Congress.”.

3 (2) The table of sections at the beginning of such
4 chapter is amended by adding at the end the following
5 new item:

“2219. Transfer of Department of Defense funds to other departments and
agencies: limitation.”.

6 (b) CONFORMING AMENDMENT.—Section 1604 of
7 Public Law 101–189 (31 U.S.C. 1598) is repealed.
