## A BILL

To provide that certain civil defense employees and employees of the Federal Emergency Management Agency may be eligible for certain public safety officers death benefits, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. PUBLIC SAFETY OFFICERS DEATH BENEFITS**

4 **FOR CIVIL DEFENSE EMPLOYEES.**

5 (a) IN GENERAL.—Section 1204 of the Omnibus  
6 Crime Control and Safe Streets Act of 1968 (42 U.S.C.  
7 3796b) is amended in paragraph (7) (relating to the defi-  
8 nition of a public safety officer) by striking “or rescue

1 squad or ambulance crew” and inserting “rescue squad  
2 or ambulance crew, or an employee of the Federal Emer-  
3 gency Management Agency or civil defense officer”.

4 (b) EFFECTIVE DATE.—The amendment made by  
5 subsection (a) shall take effect on the date of enactment  
6 of this Act and shall apply only to employees of the Fed-  
7 eral Emergency Management Agency or civil defense offi-  
8 cers who are injured or die in the line of duty on or after  
9 such date.
