Ms. NORTON introduced the following bill; which was referred to the
Committee on the Judiciary

A BILL

For the relief of Marlene Anita Hudson.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*
3 That (a) the Secretary of the Treasury shall, out of any
4 money in the Treasury of the United States not otherwise
5 appropriated, pay to Marlene Anita Hudson of Washing-
6 ton, District of Columbia, a lump-sum payment in the
7 amount of \$38,400.

8 (b) It shall be unlawful for any amount in excess of
9 10 percent of the lump-sum payment designated in sub-
10 section (a) to be paid to or received by any agent or attor-
11 ney in consideration for services rendered in connection

1 with such lump-sum payment. Any person who violates the
2 preceding sentence shall be fined not more than \$1,000.

3 (c) The amount payable under this Act shall be in
4 addition to any other amount which (if this Act had not
5 been enacted) would otherwise be payable under any other
6 provision of law based on the death of James A. Hudson.
