Mr. VALENTINE introduced the following bill; which was referred to the
Committee on Ways and Means

A BILL

To revive and extend until January 1, 1999, a suspension
of duty on Cefixime.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SUSPENSION OF DUTY ON CEFIXIME.**

4 Heading 9902.31.02 of the Harmonized Tariff
5 Schedule of the United States is amended by striking
6 “12/31/92” and inserting “12/31/98”.

7 **SEC. 2. APPLICABILITY.**

8 (a) IN GENERAL.—The amendment made by section
9 1 applies with respect to goods entered, or withdrawn from
10 warehouse for consumption, on or after the 15th day after
11 the date of the enactment of this Act.

1 (b) RETROACTIVE APPLICATION TO CERTAIN EN-
2 TRIES.—Notwithstanding section 514 of the Tariff Act of
3 1930 (19 U.S.C. 1514) or any other provision of law, upon
4 a request filed with the appropriate customs officer before
5 the date that is 90 days after the date of the enactment
6 of this Act, any entry, or withdrawal from warehouse for
7 consumption, of goods described in heading 9902.31.02 of
8 the Harmonized Tariff Schedule of the United States that
9 was made—

10 (1) after December 31, 1992, and

11 (2) before the 15th day after the date of the en-
12 actment of this Act,

13 shall be liquidated or reliquidated as though such entry
14 or withdrawal occurred on the 15th day after the date of
15 the enactment of this Act.
