**AN ACT**

Making emergency supplemental appropriations for relief from the major, widespread flooding in the Midwest for the fiscal year ending September 30, 1993, and for other purposes.

1       *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2       *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*  
3       That the following sums are appropriated, out of any  
4       money in the Treasury not otherwise appropriated, to pro-  
5       vide emergency supplemental appropriations for relief  
6       from the major, widespread flooding in the Midwest for  
7       the fiscal year ending September 30, 1993, and for other  
8       purposes, namely:



1 quest as an emergency requirement as defined in the Bal-  
2 anced Budget and Emergency Deficit Control Act of 1985,  
3 as amended, is transmitted by the President to Congress,  
4 the total to remain available until June 30, 1994: *Pro-*  
5 *vided*, That from funds previously made available in Public  
6 Law 102-368 by Presidential declaration, \$100,000,000  
7 to remain available until ~~March 31~~ *June 30*, 1994, shall  
8 be for 1993 crop losses only: *Provided further*, That if  
9 prior to April 1, 1994, the President determines that ex-  
10 traordinary circumstances exist that warrant further as-  
11 sistance, the Secretary of Agriculture shall use such funds  
12 of the Commodity Credit Corporation as are necessary to  
13 make payments in an amount equal to 50.04 percent of  
14 each eligible claim as determined under title XXII of Pub-  
15 lic Law 101-624 and to make payments for catastrophic  
16 losses where the deficiency in production of the crop ex-  
17 ceeds 75 percent: *Provided further*, That all additional  
18 amounts made available herein are subject to the terms  
19 and conditions in Public Law 101-624: *Provided further*,  
20 That no payments to producers under this Act shall be  
21 at a rate greater than 50.04 percent of each eligible claim,  
22 except that for the deficiency in production of the crop  
23 in excess of 75 percent, the rate of payment shall be 90  
24 percent: *Provided further*, That Congress hereby des-  
25 ignates the entire amount provided herein as an emer-

1 gency requirement pursuant to section 251(b)(2)(D)(i) of  
2 the Balanced Budget and Emergency Deficit Control Act  
3 of 1985, as amended: *Provided further*, That notwith-  
4 standing any provision of Public Law 103-50, funds pro-  
5 vided by such Act shall not be expended for 1993 crop  
6 losses resulting from 1993 natural disasters, and claims  
7 for assistance from funds provided by that Act by produc-  
8 ers with 1990, 1991, and 1992 crop losses shall be paid  
9 only to the extent such claims are filed by September 17,  
10 1993.

11 SOIL CONSERVATION SERVICE

12 WATERSHED AND FLOOD PREVENTION OPERATIONS

13 For an additional amount to repair damages to the  
14 waterways and watersheds resulting from the Midwest  
15 floods and other natural disasters of 1993, ~~\$25,000,000~~  
16 *\$60,000,000*, to remain available until ~~June~~ *September* 30,  
17 1994 to carry out the Emergency Watershed Protection  
18 Program of the Soil Conservation Service, *of which*  
19 *\$25,000,000, shall be available only to the extent an official*  
20 *budget request for a specific dollar amount, that includes*  
21 *designation of the entire amount of the request as an emer-*  
22 *gency requirement as defined in the Balanced Budget and*  
23 *Emergency Deficit Control Act of 1985, is transmitted by*  
24 *the President to Congress. Provided, That the entire*  
25 amount is designated by Congress as an emergency re-

1 requirement pursuant to section 251(b)(2)(D)(i) of the Bal-  
2 anced Budget and Emergency Deficit Control Act of 1985,  
3 as amended: *Provided further, That if the Secretary deter-*  
4 *mines that the cost of land and levee restoration exceeds*  
5 *the fair market value of an affected cropland, the Secretary*  
6 *may use sufficient amounts from funds provided under this*  
7 *head to accept bids from willing sellers to enroll such crop-*  
8 *land inundated by the Midwest floods of 1993 in any of*  
9 *the affected States in the Wetlands Reserve Program as au-*  
10 *thorized by subchapter C of Chapter 1 of subtitle D of title*  
11 *XII of the Food Security Act of 1985 (16 U.S.C. 3837).*

19 *natural disasters: Provided, That the entire amount is des-*  
20 *ignated by Congress as an emergency requirement pursu-*  
21 *ant to section 251(b)(2)(D)(i) of the Balanced Budget and*  
22 *Emergency Deficit Control Act of 1985.*

23 EMERGENCY CONSERVATION PROGRAM

24 For an additional amount for emergency expenses re-  
25 sulting from the Midwest floods and other natural disas-  
26 ters of 1993, ~~\$20,000,000~~ \$30,000,000, to remain avail-

1 able until June 30, 1994: *Provided*, That the entire  
2 amount is designated by Congress as an emergency re-  
3 quirement pursuant to section 251(b)(2)(D)(i) of the Bal-  
4 anced Budget and Emergency Deficit Control Act of 1985,  
5 as amended.

8 *For an additional amount to assist in the recovery*

11 *including the cost of modifying loans as defined in section*  
12 *502 of the Congressional Budget Act of 1974, \$5,985,000*  
13 *to remain available through June 30, 1994: Provided, That*  
14 *these funds are available to subsidize additional gross obli-*  
15 *gations for the principal amount of direct loans not to ex-*  
16 *ceed \$15,000,000: Provided further, That the entire*  
17 *amount is designated by Congress as an emergency re-*  
18 *quirement pursuant to section 251(b)(2)(D)(i) of the Bal-*
