A BILL

To amend the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971 to ban activities of political action committees in elections for Federal office and to reduce the limitation on contributions to candidates by persons other than multicandidate political committees.

1 **SECTION 1. BAN ON ACTIVITIES OF POLITICAL ACTION**
2 **COMMITTEES IN ELECTIONS FOR FEDERAL**
3 **OFFICE.**

4 (a) IN GENERAL.—Title III of the Federal Election
5 Campaign Act of 1971 (2 U.S.C. 431 et seq.) is amended
6 by adding at the end the following new section:

7 “BAN ON FEDERAL ELECTION ACTIVITIES BY POLITICAL
8 ACTION COMMITTEES

9 “SEC. 324. (a) Notwithstanding any other provision
10 of this Act, no person other than an individual or a politi-
11 cal committee may make contributions, solicit or receive
12 contributions, or make expenditures for the purpose of in-
13 fluencing an election for Federal office.”.

14 **SEC. 2. REDUCTION IN LIMITATION ON CONTRIBUTIONS TO**
15 **CANDIDATES BY PERSONS OTHER THAN**
16 **MULTICANDIDATE POLITICAL COMMITTEES.**

17 Section 315(a)(1)(A) of the Federal Election Cam-
18 paign Act of 1971 (2 U.S.C. 441a(a)(1)(A)) is amended
19 by striking out “\$1,000” and inserting in lieu thereof
20 “\$500”.
