## A BILL

To suspend until January 1, 1996, the duty on certain textile spinning machines.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. CERTAIN TEXTILE SPINNING MACHINES.**

4 Subchapter II of chapter 99 of the Harmonized Tar-  
5 iff Schedule of the United States is amended by inserting  
6 in numerical sequence the following new subheading:

“	9902.84.52	Textile machines for spinning man-made fibers (provided for in subheading 8445.20.00), and their associated parts, accessories, and equipment (provided for in subheading 8448.39.10), the foregoing machines having winders with variable speeds with a maximum take-up speed of 8,000 meters per minute, when imported as an entirety .....	Free	No change	No change	On or before 12/31/95	”.
