Mr. RANGEL introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Natural Resources

A BILL

To designate certain units of the National Park System as the Manhattan National Historical Park, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. MANHATTAN NATIONAL HISTORICAL PARK.**

4 (a) ESTABLISHMENT.—There is established the Man-
5 hattan National Historical Park (hereafter in this Act re-
6 ferred to as the “park”).

7 (b) UNITS OF PARK.—The park shall be comprised
8 of the following units: Castle Clinton National Monument,
9 Federal Hall National Memorial, Theodore Roosevelt
10 Birthplace National Historic Site, General Grant National

1 Memorial, Hamilton Grange National Memorial, Saint
2 Paul's Church National Historic Site, and the head-
3 quarters facility located at 26 Wall Street, Manhattan.

4 **SEC. 2. ADMINISTRATION OF MANHATTAN NATIONAL HIS-**
5 **TORICAL PARK.**

6 (a) IN GENERAL.—Each of the units of the park shall
7 be administered in accordance with this Act, with the pro-
8 visions of law which established the respective unit, and
9 with the provisions of law generally applicable to units of
10 the national park system, including the Act entitled “An
11 Act to establish a National Park Service, and for other
12 purposes”, approved August 25, 1916 (39 Stat. 535; 16
13 U.S.C. 1, 2, 3, and 4) and the Act of August 21, 1935
14 (49 Stat. 666; 16 U.S.C. 461–467).

15 (b) COOPERATIVE AGREEMENTS.—(1) The Secretary
16 of the Interior is authorized to enter into cooperative
17 agreements with the city of New York, the State of New
18 York (or political subdivisions thereof), or any private or-
19 ganization to mark, interpret, maintain, restore, or pro-
20 vide technical assistance for the preservation, interpreta-
21 tion, and maintenance of any property, or portions there-
22 of, located within the units of the park.

23 (2) In administering the park, the Secretary is au-
24 thorized to enter into cooperative agreements with the
25 State of New York, or any political subdivision thereof,

1 for the rendering, on a reimbursable basis, of rescue, fire-
2 fighting, and law enforcement services and cooperative as-
3 sistance by nearby law enforcement and fire preventive
4 agencies.

5 **SEC. 3. AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.**

6 There is authorized to be appropriated such sums as
7 may be necessary to carry out this Act, subject to the limi-
8 tation on amounts authorized to be appropriated for devel-
9 opment at Hamilton Grange National Memorial specified
10 in section 5 of the Joint Resolution of April 27, 1962,
11 as amended by Public Law 100-701 (102 Stat. 4641).
