Mr. WYDEN (for himself, Mr. DEFAZIO, Mr. FINGERHUT, Ms. FURSE, Mr. KOPETSKI, Mr. STOKES, Mr. SAWYER, and Mr. BROWN of Ohio) introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means

A BILL

To provide that individuals shall not be required to repay certain overpayments of emergency unemployment compensation.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*
3 That if an individual received any emergency unemploy-
4 ment compensation to which such individual was not enti-
5 tled and such individual would have been entitled to such
6 compensation under section 102(b)(2)(B) of the Unem-
7 ployment Compensation Amendments of 1992 had the
8 subsequent benefit year referred to in clause (ii) of such
9 section 102(b)(2)(B) not expired or terminated—

1 (1) on and after the date of the enactment of
2 this Act, no repayment of such compensation (and
3 no notice of an overpayment by reason of the receipt
4 of such compensation) shall be required under sec-
5 tion 105 of the Emergency Unemployment Com-
6 pensation Act of 1991 (Public Law 102-164, as
7 amended), and

8 (2) any amount heretofore recovered with re-
9 spect to such compensation shall be returned.

10 The preceding sentence shall only apply with respect to
11 compensation paid for weeks beginning after July 3, 1992,
12 and before March 7, 1993.
